

Postpartum Health Indicators VIRGINIA FACT SHEET



Results shown are self-reported by 638 Virginia respondents to the 2020 Postpartum Assessment of Health Survey (PAHS) at 12-14 months after giving birth. Data was collected from January 2021 to March 2022. Results are weighted to be representative of the collective experiences for the population of postpartum people who had a live birth in Virginia in 2020.





Postpartum Uninsurance








A usual source of care is a place or provider that an individual or family usually goes to when sick or in need of advice about their health. Emergency rooms and hospitals are not considered usual sources of care.

Mental Health

11% of postpartum people in VA reported **depression** at one year postpartum

Depression defined as a score of 3 or greater (major depressive disorder likely) on the PHQ-2




11% of postpartum people in VA reported anxiety at one year


Anxiety defined as a score of 3 or greater (generalized anxiety disorder likely) on the GAD-2

Postpartum Anxiety by Race-Ethnicity






Any Mistreatment


of postpartum people in VA reported some form of mistreatment by care providers during childbirth.




Intimate Partner Violence was reported by 40/0
